Amesbury Sports Park has new owners !

The park is known locally and regionally for recreational activities, Brewfest and Spartan Race.

Amesbury, Mass. — MaryCarol Fowler, President of the Amesbury Sports Park, has announced that the park is under new ownership as of this month.

Former owner **Ted Dipple** recently entered into a sale agreement with longtime employees, MaryCarol Fowler, Kevin Jacques, Candace MacLean and Meredith Robinson.

The sports park is known here and in the region as a place to pursue a variety of recreational activities, and as an event venue. Among its offerings are winter and summer tubing and annual events such as the Brewfest, and the Spartan Race.

The Amesbury Sports Park is also available for birthday, anniversary, holiday and other parties, wedding receptions, and corporate events. The function room can accommodate up to 100 seated guests. The entire facility is for rent for private events and offers outdoor catering for over 10,000 guests.

The monthly wine dinners at Amesbury Sports Park have a devoted clientel. The dinners occur on the first Friday of each month, and reservations are required no later than Tuesday of that week.

Winter Sports Park set to on open January 6th !

Goshen, NY - If you're looking for great cold weather fun check out snow tubing at Orange County's Thomas Bull Memorial Park this winter. The Orange County Snow Tubing & Winter Sports Park is scheduled to open Friday, January 6th, conditions permitting. The park is situated in the Thomas Bull Memorial Park.

The 800 foot snow tubing hill features two cable lifts, groomed lanes, and specially designed tubes built for a speedy, thrilling ride. Tubers must meet a minimum height requirement of 42 inches.

"Snow tubing at Orange County Park has become one of the County's most popular winter time attractions," said County Executive Edward A. Diana. "It's fun, affordable, and close to home. If you've never been, don't let another winter pass without checking it out. One thrilling run down the hill and you'll wonder why you waited so long to visit the park in winter. Best of all, you get a lift back up the hill!"

The park also features an ice skating rink, sledding hill, and cross-country ski trails. People must provide their own equipment for these free activities.

The Graham M. Skea Lodge, located at the crest of the tubing hill, offers beautiful views of the Hudson Valley and features a concession/restaurant and large stone fireplace - perfect for warming up or watching the tubers.
